EXAMPLES OF THE PROGRAM'S ADVOCACY*:

- A parent has difficulty locating an MCO dentist to provide the necessary treatment for a family member.*
- A doctor's request for medically necessary care (such as private duty nursing) for a medically fragile person with I/DD has been denied, or the hours reduced, by the MCO.*
- A person with I/DD needs physical therapy, but the nearby company that was providing that therapy is no longer in the MCO's network.*
- A person with I/DD needs transportation to a doctor's office. The family does not know that this transportation is provided by a company that is contracted by NJ Medicaid to provide this service.

***NOTE:** We will advocate for the best interests of each individual, but there is never a guarantee of a successful outcome.

THE MAINSTREAMING MEDICAL CARE PROGRAM HAS AN EXCELLENT REPUTATION THROUGHOUT NEW JERSEY FOR HEALTH CARE ADVOCACY ON BEHALF OF PERSONS WITH INTELLECTUAL AND DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES. WE PROVIDE:

- Information and advocacy on the NJ Division of Developmental Disabilities (DDD) policy requiring Medicaid eligibility, as well as information on Supplemental Security Income (SSI), Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI), Disabled Adult Child (DAC) status, and NJ Medicaid -- including Medicaid Expansion.
- Information and advocacy on NJ's Medicaid managed care organizations (MCOs) for individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities (I/DD) who experience a problem in accessing medical, dental, or mental health services from their MCO.
- Information and advocacy for persons with I/DD who have both Medicare and Medicaid benefits— the "dual eligibles," including the Medicare managed care program known as Dual Eligible Special Needs Program or D-SNP.
- Information and advocacy for persons who are dually diagnosed with both a developmental disability and a mental health disorder.
- Participation on statewide committees that make recommendations on how to improve health care services for persons with I/DD.
- Annual health care conference in late Spring that focuses on the most current and relevant information on medical, dental, and behavioral health care for persons with I/DD. This conference is for health care professionals, provider agency staff, educators, personnel from government agencies, family members and other caregivers.
